Terms and conditions

Senior Superstar Competition

- Information on how to enter the competition forms part of the competition conditions.
- Entry into the competition is deemed an acceptance of these terms and conditions.
- The Promoter of this event is Brisbane City Council.
- To be eligible to enter this competition, an entrant must:
 - not be an employee or contractor of the Promoter or an immediate family member of an employee or contractor of the Promoter;
 - be an amateur performer (no professionals please);
 - be a Brisbane resident. Proof of residency may be required;
 - be aged 50 years and over;
 - confirm their availability for the final; and
 - complete the entry form and present it in person at the open audition, Ithaca Auditorium, Floor 2, City Hall on Wednesday 13 May 2009, commencing 9am.

If you are unable to attend the audition due to other commitments (i.e. work/illness), your entry form will be considered at the discretion of the producer.

- Entrants may be:
 - a solo performer
 - a duo/trio; or
 - a group.
- The competition consists of:
 - the open audition
 - six heats;
 - two semi-finals; and
 - a grand final.
- Entrants consent to:
 - being photographed for the purpose of the competition and the promotion of the competition
 - being filmed and recorded during the audition, heats, semi-finals and grand final for Senior Superstar talent quest and the subsequent recordings being edited and telecast at the sole discretion of the Promoter.
- The Promoter owns all intellectual property rights in the footage and broadcast of all performances in the competition, and no fee will be payable to the entrants.
- Entrants must provide their own props, instruments or backing music in the form of a CD or sheet music for the piano accompanist for their performance.
- Open audition
 - The open audition will take place on Wednesday 13 May 2009 in the Ithaca Auditorium, Floor 2, City Hall, 9am to 1pm.

- An entrant at the open audition must perform a part of their act, which is to be no longer than four minutes.
- Successful entrants at the open audition will be notified by mail of their invitation to compete in one of the six heats, by Friday 29 May 2009.

11. Heats

- Heats and semi-finals will be held throughout Brisbane in June, July and August. Successful entrants will be allocated to perform in a club closest to them.
- Entrants must report to the stage area at the participating club no later than 30 minutes prior to the commencement of their assigned heat.
- If an entrant does not report to the stage area by the required time or is not ready to perform at his/her allocated time, their performance may be forfeited at the Promoter's discretion.
- Four acts will be chosen from each heat to compete in the semi-finals. Twelve finalists will be chosen (6 from each semi-final) to perform at the grand final.
- The twelve finalists chosen will be notified of their invitation to compete at the grand final of Senior Superstar at the conclusion of the semi-finals.

12. Grand final

- The grand final will be held in the Main Auditorium, City Hall on Saturday 15 August commencing 2pm. There will be one (1) grand final winner selected by the judging panel.
- Finalists must report to the stage area no later than 30 minutes prior to the commencement of the grand final.
- After reporting to stage, a finalist will be given an approximate time for their performance.
- A finalist will forfeit their place (at the Promoter's discretion) if they fail to report to the stage area by the required time or are unable to perform at the allocated time.
- A finalist must perform their act, which is to be no longer than four minutes.

13. Judging

- Entrants will be judged on their ability, presentation and audience appeal. The judging criteria will be the same at the open audition, all heats, semi-finals and the grand final.
- Judging will be by suitably qualified judges in accordance with the criteria stated above. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

14. Prizes

- The grand final winner will receive the Senior Superstar trophy. The total value of this prize is up to \$150.

- The prize is non-transferable and not redeemable for cash.
 - Any additional expenses incurred by the prizewinner in accepting the prize will be the sole responsibility of the winner.
 - Further prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Promoter.
- The Promoter collects entrants' personal information in order to conduct the competition. If the information requested is not provided, the entrant may not participate in the competition. By entering the competition, unless otherwise advised, each entrant also agrees that the Promoter may use this information, in any media for future promotional, marketing and publicity purposes without any further reference, payment of other compensation to the entrant. Entrants' personal information will only be disclosed to associated sponsors of the promotion for the purpose of delivering prizes.
 - The Promoter reserves the right to modify these terms and conditions at any time and to cancel or amend the competition at any time without notice or further recourse to the entrants.
 - The Promoter accepts no responsibility whatsoever for late, misplaced, lost or ineligible entries. The Promoter makes no representations or warranties as to the quality, suitability or merchantability of the prizes.
